THIS MATTER Having come on regularly before the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council at its regular meeting of May 12, 1980 upon petition by Craig Whalley, a member of the Board of Directors of No Oilport!, as presented to the Council by Craig Ritchie, attorney for No Oilport!, for intervention in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification by the Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Corporation, the Council having heard argument pertaining to the merits of intervention by No Oilport! and the Council having duly voted to allow intervention by No Oil Port!,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED By the Council that No Oilport!, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Washington, is accorded status as a limited party intervenor in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification of the Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Corporation, such status being limited solely to the intervenor's presentation of evidence concerning possible impacts and their mitigation that may be caused by construction and operation of the project not available from other intervenors. This accordance of intervention binds the intervenor to accept the record and to refrain from any action to delay or interfere with the conduct of hearings which may be held on this matter. Within the constraints cited above, the intervenor is given all rights of intervention according to Title 463 of the Washington Administrative Code.
