ORDER ALLOWING
INTERVENTION BY
TOWN OF WILBUR

THIS MATTER Having come on regularly before the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council at its regular meeting of February 23, 1981 upon petition by Philip W. Borst, Town Attorney for the Town of Wilbur, for intervention in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification by the Washington Water Power Company, the Council having heard argument pertaining to the merits of intervention by the Town of Wilbur and the Council having duly voted to allow intervention by the Town of Wilbur,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED By the Council that the Town of Wilbur, a municipal corporation of the fourth class in the State of Washington, is accorded status as an intervenor in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification of the Washington Water Power Creston Generating Station, as it relates to the construction of transmission facilities within the Town of Wilbur city limits, to those socioeconomic and environmental effects of construction that may impact the Town of Wilbur as a direct result of the Creston Generating Station, and to all other material factors directly affecting the interests of the Town of Wilbur. This accordance of intervention binds the intervenor to not unduly delay the proceeding or prejudice the rights of existing parties. Intervenors are given all rights of intervention according to Title 463 of the Washington Administrative Code.
