THIS MATTER Having come on regularly before the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council at its regular meeting of March 23, 1981 upon petition by Philip W. Borst, Prosecuting Attorney for Lincoln County, for intervention in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification by the Washington Water Power Company, the Council having heard argument pertaining to the merits of intervention by Lincoln County and the Council having duly voted to allow intervention by Lincoln County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED By the Council that Lincoln County, a County of the sixth class in the State of Washington, is accorded status as an intervenor in the proceedings relating to the application for site certification of the Washington Water Power Creston Generating Station, as it relates to the construction and operation of a 2000 megawatt coal fired steam electrical generating facility and associated transmission system, and as it relates to the socioeconomic and environmental effects of construction that may impact Lincoln County as a direct result of the Creston Generating Station, and to all other material factors directly affecting the interests of Lincoln County. This accordance of intervention binds the intervenor to not unduly delay the proceeding or prejudice the rights of existing parties. Intervenors are given all rights of intervention according to Title 463 of the Washington Administrative Code.
