

RESOLUTION NO. 189

WHEREAS, The Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council has required the Washington Public Power Supply System to conduct a bioassay program in the vicinity of its Nuclear Projects Numbers 3 and 5, as a condition of a revised NPDES permit, and

WHEREAS, The Council recognizes that short term increases in turbidity may result during construction of the intake and discharge facilities;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council that it grant a temporary waiver of the water quality standards subject to the following conditions:

1. Turbidity standards are waived for construction and dismantling phases of the intake and discharge structures only; each phase shall not exceed two weeks. Construction must be confined to the period June 1 to September 15 unless otherwise specifically approved by the Council.
2. Spoils removed from the proposed operation shall be disposed of in an approved onshore landfill.
3. Proposed backfill shall be with rock, not more than 20 percent of which weigh less than 50 pounds, pieces laid firmly against each other to interlock firmly,
4. No discharge of visible oil or grease will be permitted to reach any receiving water.


