

RESOLUTION NO. 222

WHEREAS, By letter dated May 17, 1984, the Washington Public Power Supply System did, in accordance with Section 111.D of the Site Certification Agreement for WNP-3/5, request a turbidity waiver for and outline construction activities associated with work to repair the Cooley slide area drainage structure; and

WHEREAS, The Council recognizes that short-term increases in turbidity may result during the course of this work;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council that it grants a temporary waiver of the water quality standards subject to the following conditions:


1. Disposal of spoil material from shaping or dressing activity shall be in such a manner as to prevent entry into the Chehalis River.
2. No discharge of oil or grease shall be permitted to reach any receiving water.
3. The water quality criteria set forth in WAC 173.201.030(2)(c)(vi) as for turbidity is hereby modified for the period beginning 0100 hours June 1, 1984 and terminating 2400 hours, August 31, 1984 in accordance with the following conditions:
  - a) All reasonable measures to reduce turbid runoff from the work area shall be taken.
  - b) The C-1 Pump Station shall be operated to prevent water flow through the work area.
4. The Supply System shall perform a visual inspection of the improvements authorized by this resolution on a quarterly basis and shall perform a special visual inspection of the improvements following rainstorms of more than 2.5 inches in 24 hours, or following a thaw after a period of freezing temperatures of more than three days.
5. The state of Washington, acting by and through the Council, does certify that there is no applicable standard under 33 U.S.C. 1311, 1312, 1316, and 1317. The State does certify that any discharges to navigable waters which may result from construction of WNP-3/5 so long as done in accordance with this resolution or subsequent resolutions and the Site Certification Agreement executed on October 27, 1976, will comply with applicable State law and the limitations identified herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That unless specifically extended by the Council, the authorizations, approvals and requirements contained in conditions 1 through 3 and 5 shall expire at 2400 hours, August 31, 1984.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That unless specifically extended by the Council, the inspection requirements of condition 4 shall end on March 31, 1985, except that the report for the first calendar quarter of 1985 may be submitted to the Council between April 1 and June 30, 1985.
