

RESOLUTION NO. 263

WHEREAS, The Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council (Council) established that the Washington Public Power Supply System (Supply System) did, during a two month period in August 1988, violate the WNP-3 Site Certification Agreement and state water pollution control requirements when approximately 2,800 gallons of gasoline leaked from piping at the site's service station; and

WHEREAS, the Council issued Order No. 656, Order No. 657, and Order No. 659 requiring clean up, sampling, and monitoring activities as result of the leak; and

WHEREAS, The Supply System, by letters dated October 26, 1992 and January 22, 1993 requested that the Council Orders relating to the gasoline spill be closed and that no further clean up action or monitoring be required, and

WHEREAS, The Department of Ecology in their Quarterly Report for the period of July through September 1992 reported to the Council that continued treatment of the extracted water will not provide significant benefit and the amount of contamination remaining will not significantly impact human health or the environment; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Ecology has recommend that gasoline clean up activities at WNP-3, including sampling and analysis be discontinued.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Council finds that the Supply System has complied with Order Nos. 656, 657, and 659.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Council hereby approves the Supply System's request and closes Order No. 656, Order No. 657, and Order No. 659 and that clean up activities, water or soil monitoring or sampling relating to the 1988 gasoline spill may be discontinued.
