Re: Tesoro Savage Oil Terminal Proposal
Submitted at the EFSEC hearing in Vancouver, WA May 28, 2014

Please consider the following:

- (1) Please hold another land use consistency hearing, to be scheduled once the environmental impact statement is available. The EIS is necessary and legally required for the public, the city, and the Council to review the proposal for land use consistency.
- (2) Washington Law requires EFSEC hearings to be open to consideration of the environmental impact of the proposal. (WAC 197-11-535) The project would adversely affect air quality, water quality, and endanger our communities and special places like the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area.
- (3) The Tesoro Savage terminal proposal is incompatible with surrounding land uses. For example, there's a billion dollar investment planned to revitalize Vancouver's waterfront and reconnect the community with the Columbia River. This massive oil terminal and daily influx of oil trains would undermine this project.
- (4) The oil terminal would be inconsistent with the Lewis & Clark Discovery Greenway Trail, a segment of which has been planned to be sited immediately adjacent to the proposed oil tanker storage site.
