Tim Cullinan, Science and Bird Conservation Director

Tim joined Audubon Washington in 1988 as a contract employee representing Audubon for the implementation of the state's Timber, Fish and Wildlife agreement. A wildlife biologist, he became a full-time Audubon employee in 1992, with responsibilities for bird conservation projects, evaluation of proposed habitat conservation plans, field-based science programs, citizen science projects, and assistance to chapters with various conservation activities. He is currently leading our Important Bird Areas project. Before coming to Audubon, Tim conducted research on Ruffed Grouse and Canada Geese in upstate New York. He earned a BS degree in zoology from Ohio State University, and an MS degree in environmental and forest biology from State University of New York/Syracuse.
