Page 7 MR. THOMPSON: This is Jon Thompson with the 1 Attorney General's Office, advisor for EFSEC. 2 CHAIR DREW: Okay. Thank you. We will move 3 4 on to our project and operational updates. Kittitas Valley Wind Project? 5 MR. OVERTON: Yeah, this is Kyle Overton, 6 7 the EFSEC site specialist for the facility. Kittitas 8 Valley was unable to attend this month's meeting, but they wanted me to let you know that there's no 9 nonroutine items to report and their -- their full 10 report is in the packet. 11 12 CHAIR DREW: Thank you. 13 Wild Horse Wind Power Project? 14 MR. OVERTON: This is Kyle Overton of EFSEC again. Wild Horse was also unable to attend this 15 16 meeting. Same update as Kittitas Valley. They had no nonroutine items and their full report is in the packet. 17 18 CHAIR DREW: Okay. And there you have the Wild Horse that also has their Technical Advisory 19 20 Committee 2020 update. Thank you, Ms. Owens. Desert -- nope, Chehalis Generation 21 22 Facility, is that Mr. Smith? 23 MR. SMITH: Yes, ma'am. Good afternoon, 24 Chair Drew and Council and EFSEC Staff. I'm Jeremy 25 Smith, the environmental analyst for Chehalis Generation

MOON: This is Amy Moon. Good 7 afternoon, Chair Drew and Councilmembers. I'm providing 8 an update for the Desert Claim Project. EFSEC -- EFSEC Staff continues to coordinate with Desert Claim, and at 9 this time, there are no specific project updates. 10 11 CHAIR DREW: Thank you. 12 Columbia Solar Project update, Ms. Kidder. 13 Thank you. Good afternoon, MS. KIDDER: 14 Chair Drew and Council. For the record, my name is Ami Kidder. EFSEC Staff are continuing coordination with 15 16 the certificate holder as they prepare plans for submission review. Staff will continue to update the 17 18 Council as we progress. Are there any questions? 19 CHAIR DREW: Any questions? 20 Hearing none, moving on to Grays Harbor 21 Energy Center, Mr. Overton? 22 MR. OVERTON: This is Kyle Overton. Sorry, I'm having some technical difficulties. There for the 23 month of August and July -- or August -- July, I believe 24 25 there was no nonroutine items for Grays Harbor.

1 CHAIR DREW: Thank you. And then WNP-1/4 and Columbia Generating 2 Station, Mr. Whitehead. 3 4 MR. WHITEHEAD: Good afternoon. I'm Kip 5 Whitehead, and I am from Energy Northwest. For both 6 WNP-1/4 and the Columbia Generating Station, there are 7 no updates to report. 8 A couple months ago, the EFSEC Council had a few questions that they wanted Energy Northwest to 9 respond to. These questions are how is Energy Northwest 10 responding to the COVID-19 pandemic? Energy Northwest's 11 12 initial response to the pandemic included removal of all nonessential employees from the various work sites and 13 14 implementation of a work from home strategy. Only essential personnel have been reporting to the 15 16 facilities. Benton-Franklin County is currently under modified phase one. Energy Northwest is working to 17 transition nonessential employees back to the facilities 18 in a reduced capacity with the continued focus on 19 20 working from home. The next question is confirmation that the 21 22 facility is still in operation. Energy Northwest facilities remain in operation. The Columbia Generating 23 24 Station's net electrical generation for July was just 25 short of 762,000 megawatt hours.

And the final question was, are there any 1 2 updates on plan upgrades or projects at -- for the Columbia Generating Station or WNP-1/4? Energy 3 Northwest recently signed a new lease agreement with the 4 Department of Energy. The new lease agreement requires 5 6 the industrial development complex located at WNP-1/4 to 7 no longer use groundwater at its water source by July 8 2022. The IDC is planning to use surface water from the Columbia River as its water source and will be 9 10 installing a new water filtration system at the site. 11 CHAIR DREW: Are there any questions from 12 Councilmembers? I don't hear any questions, so thank you 13 14 very much for your report. We are now moving on to the first quarter 15 16 cost allocation, and I believe Ms. Kidder is going to speak to this? 17 MS. KIDDER: Yes, thank you. I have for the 18 Council the updated cost allocation percentages for the 19 first quarter fiscal year 2021 as we present every 20 quarter. You will find this on the green paper in your 21 22 Council packets. 23 For Kittitas Wind Valley -- Kittitas Valley 24 Wind Power Project, 10 percent; Wild Horse Wind Power 25 Project, 10 percent; Columbia Generating Station, 27

Page 11 percent; Columbia Solar, 11 percent; WNP-1, 3 percent; 1 2 Whistling Ridge Energy Project, 3 percent; Grays Harbor 1&2, 13 percent; Chehalis Generation Project, 12 3 percent; Desert Claim Wind Power Project, 8 percent; and 4 5 Grays Harbor Energy 3&4, 3 percent. 6 CHAIR DREW: Are there any questions? 7 Okay. Thank you. 8 The other update we have on our agenda today 9 is the Air Rule update, so Ms. Kidder? MS. KIDDER: 10 Thank you. If the Council will recall, the revisions to EFSEC's Air Rule, Washington 11 12 Administrative Code 463.78.005, which adopts Ecology air regulation by reference, was approved by the Council to 13 be filed with the Code Revisor's Office and was open for 14 public comment from June 3rd through July 18th. 15 No 16 public comments were received. 17 As no comments were received, EFSEC manager, Sonia Bumpus, signed the form CR-103, which was filed on 18 July 28th. This commenced a 30-day waiting period 19 before the new rule will become effective. That period 20 continues through August 27th and the updated WAC 21 22 463-78-005 will be in effect the following day, August 28th, bringing EFSEC into alignment with current Ecology 23 air rules. 24 25 Are there any questions?
