MR. SCHNITGER: Good afternoon, Chair Drew, EFSEC Council, and staff.

There is nonroutine to report for the period.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
Moving on to the Grays Harbor Energy Center, Mr. Sherin.

MR. SHERIN: This is Chris Sherin, the plant manager for Grays Harbor Energy Center. Good afternoon, Chair Drew, Councilmembers, and staff.

For the month of August, the only nonroutine item -- or report, is that we did submit a memorandum stating that we submitted a memorandum to EFSEC staff stating that we finalized the solution to our CO startup emissions issue that we encountered at the end of 2021.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
Ms. Bumpus.
MS. BUMPUS: Thank you.
Good afternoon, Chair Drew, and Councilmembers. For the record, this is Sonia Bumpus.

Council will recall at the August Council meeting, at the direction of the Council, EFSEC staff were asked to prepare a draft resolution, Draft Resolution No. 351. It should be in your packets. This draft resolution approves Grays Harbor Energy's request that's related to the compliance with their greenhouse

1 gas mitigation plan. This item was discussed quite a bit
2 during the meeting last month. A copy of that
3 resolution, as $I$ said, is in your packets. It was also
4 sent to the Council for review last week.
In the meantime, EFSEC also received one public comment related to this draft of resolution. The comment was received by the permittee. A copy of that comment was also provided to the Council for review and preparation for the proposed action today. That public comment was reviewed by staff and EFSEC's assistant attorney general. It proposes modification to the last stanza of the resolution to make some clarifications with respect to the engagement in the Climate Commitment Act. And staff are prepared to make changes to the resolution in light of that comment if the Council concurs today.

So I'll leave it right there for now.
I also wanted to make mention to the Council that Jon Thompson is on the line to answer questions regarding his review and the resolution.

We also have Karen McGaffey on the line as well if there's questions about the comment from the permittee.

> CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
> Are there any questions for staff?
> If you could, Ms. Owens, turn to page 41 of the

1 packet where we have the language of the resolution.
2 Thank you.
Is there a motion putting the resolution before us for approval?

Councilmembers?
MS. KELLY: This is Kate Kelly. I move we --
CHAIR DREW: Approve.
MS. KELLY: -- approve the resolution.
MR. YOUNG: Point of clarification, Chair
Drew.
CHAIR DREW: Yes.
MR. YOUNG: That this appears to be the previous version of the resolution --

CHAIR DREW: Yes.
MR. YOUNG: -- rather than the more recent one.
Is that -- is that intended?
CHAIR DREW: Yes. We will amend it.
MR. YOUNG: Thank you.
CHAIR DREW: Yes.
So second?
MR. YOUNG: Lenny Young. Second.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
So the language that we will be requesting an
amendment on is to change -- if you look at the first
sentence, "Having considered GHE's request and the

1 recommendation of EFSEC, the Council hereby confirms that
2 Grays Harbor Energy LLC's purchase of allowances under
3 the Climate Commitment Act, will satisfy the company's 4 obligations under the greenhouse mitigation plan approved 5 by the Council in 2003."

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that amendment?
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MR. THOMPSON: Chair Drew -CHAIR DREW: Yes.

MR. THOMPSON: -- this is Jon Thompson. Just to -- just for clarification. Actually, there is one proposed change in that second sentence that you just read.

CHAIR DREW: Okay.
MR. THOMPSON: And the word "purchase" would become "provide." Where it says "purchase emissions allowances," it would be changed to "provide emissions allowances" as proposed by Grays Harbor Energy.

CHAIR DREW: Oh, that's -- I had a different -- I had different language.

So withdraw that amendment. And let's amend the -- you're suggesting to change the word "purchase" or "purchase of" to "provide"?

Is that what you're suggesting?
MR. THOMPSON: Well, as I'm reading the -- so the comment letter from Grays Harbor Energy, had a block quote of the language as it previously stood under the draft resolution. And then a new block quote with how they would request that it read. I believe the -- the only difference in the second sentence is to replace the word "purchase" with the word "provide."

And this goes to their point that they might
obtain --
CHAIR DREW: Okay.
MR. THOMPSON: -- allowances through a different method. And by purchasing them maybe as a credit on a -- on a --

CHAIR DREW: Okay.
MR. THOMPSON: -- power contract.
CHAIR DREW: Yeah. I had purchasing or contracting. Provide is more -- is broader, so I can understand that.

So --
UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
CHAIR DREW: Someone is speaking. If they're speaking to this issue, I can't hear them. If they're not, I hope they mute themselves.

Okay. So the proposed amendment is to change the word "purchase" in the second -- second line, "Confirms that Grays Harbor Energy LLC's purchase of allowances."

MR. THOMPSON: Yes. So -- so I believe, Chair Drew, that -- there's two changes.

CHAIR DREW: Okay.
MR. THOMPSON: First is in that first sentence.

> It says -- it would say, "The Council hereby
confirms that Grays Harbor Energy LLC's purchase or contracting for allowances under the Climate Commitment Act," et cetera.

CHAIR DREW: Okay.
MR. THOMPSON: So there's -- there's a --
CHAIR DREW: That is where $I$ was going -- yes.
MR. THOMPSON: Yeah.
CHAIR DREW: Okay. Go ahead, Sonia.
MS. BUMPUS: Sorry. Excuse me, Chair Drew.
What I just going to say, yeah, I believe the
language that you read before is consistent with that. It's -- it's the language from the letter, if I'm understanding --

CHAIR DREW: Yes.
MS. BUMPUS: -- Jon correctly, Mr. Thompson.
MR. THOMPSON: Yes. So the thing -- the issue is with the second sentence. It's not identical. The -as I said before, the only change in the second sentence is from -- from purchase to provide.

CHAIR DREW: Oh, that's where I was confused. I didn't see that change. Thank you.

Okay. Pardon me. We will try this once again. We will -- I will request an amendment that changes in -- the word "purchase of allowances" adds "purchasing or contracting for allowances."

There's a few other changes there. I'm not -MS. BUMPUS: Chair Drew, I would recommend we just -- you just read -- I believe that the language we're adding is language directly from the comment letter.

CHAIR DREW: Yes.
MS. BUMPUS: And so --
CHAIR DREW: Can we bring that up?
MS. BUMPUS: I think we could --
CHAIR DREW: Do we have that in our packet?
No.
MS. BUMPUS: We should be able to bring it up.
CHAIR DREW: Oh, I have it on Word.
MS. BUMPUS: And I can also read it from the letter as well if we're not able to pull it up.

CHAIR DREW: There we go.
MS. BUMPUS: It will be on the last page of the letter where Grays Harbor Energy proposes the modification.

CHAIR DREW: So I will ask for a motion to replace the paragraph under the subtitle "Resolution" with the following paragraph from the Grays Harbor letter for an amendment: "Having considered GHE's request and the recommendation of EFSEC staff, the Council hereby confirms that by purchasing or contracting for allowances

1 under the Climate Commitment Act, Grays Harbor Energy LLC, will satisfy the company's obligation under the greenhouse gas mitigation plan approved by the Council in 2003. However, GHE shall remain obligated to make payments in accordance with the 2003 plan if at any time GHE is relieved of, or determined not to be subject to the requirement to provide emissions allowances under the Climate Commitment Act, including during the duration of any delay in implementation of the emissions allowance auction process."

Is there a Councilmember who would like to offer that amendment to the resolution which includes the entire document before us? This replaces the last full paragraph.

MR. YOUNG: Chair, this is Lenny Young. I -I move that that replacement be made.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
Is there a second?
MS. KELLY: Kate Kelly, second.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you. Discussion. I'm sorry that was convoluted.

Is there any discussion about this amendment?
I believe it simply clarifies the potential actions that could occur.

Okay. All those in favor of the amendment,

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please say "aye."
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COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.
Opposed?
Okay. And now we will vote on the resolution as amended.

And we already brought the resolution up before us. We voted on the amendment. And now we will discuss.

Are there any comments?
We did discuss this in detail last month, so I think the -- this resolution follows what the Council had requested.

All those in favor of this resolution, please say "aye."

COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.
CHAIR DREW: All those opposed?
The resolution is adopted. Thank you.
Moving on to the Columbia Generating Station and WNP-1/4, Ms. Najera-Paxton.

MS. NAJERA-PAXTON: Good afternoon, Chair Drew, EFSEC Councilmembers, and staff. This is Felicia Najera-Paxton.

I'm calling on behalf of Columbia Generating Station and Washington Nuclear Project 1 and 2. We have one update for this reporting period.

In July of 2022, EN received approval from EFSEC

1 to investigate a source of tritium that was measured during the commissioning of a new potable water system. The investigation is ongoing. And upon completion of the data collection, a report will be furnished to EFSEC which identifies the levels of tritium detected and coordination between the U.S. Department of Energy and Energy Northwest on the resolution.

That completes my update.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
MR. YOUNG: Question, Chair Drew.
CHAIR DREW: Yes. Go ahead, Mr. Young.
MR. YOUNG: If Ms. Najera-Paxton could address what's the status of that potable water supply right now? Is it operational? Or has that been placed in abeyance until the investigation is complete?

MS. NAJERA-PAXTON: It's operational only in that it's running for the purposes of collecting data. MR. YOUNG: But nobody is drinking from it at this point.

MS. NAJERA-PAXTON: No, no. It's not actually functioning. And there's a component for the chlorination station that has not yet been installed. And there's other components that have to be implemented in the -- the equipment itself before it can become fully operational.

MR. YOUNG: Thank you.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
Any other questions?
Okay. Moving on to our next item. The Columbia Solar Project, Mr. Hurd.

MR. HURD: Great. Good afternoon, Chair Drew, Councilmembers, and EFSEC staff. This is Owen Hurd from Tuusso Energy reporting on the Columbia Solar Project.

Penstemon remains operational. We had it offline briefly yesterday for some mowing. But nothing to report there.

On Camas, it had been delayed due to some breakers. And we're now expecting any day substantial completion, that is.

Urtica is -- had been delayed due to financing. We've had a little bit more of a delay due to some communications issues with the interconnection. But we're expecting mechanical completion shortly and then substantial completion to follow next month.

Other updates, we held our second TAC meeting at the end of August. And then had an on-site meeting just yesterday with WDFW and the landowners to discuss the planting plan revisions. The meeting was actually very productive and will be updating EFSEC staff in the next day on that.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you. I understand, too, there was a landowner change. And so I believe Ms. Hafkemeyer communicated to you or your team to make sure that person was up to speed as well. Thank you.

MR. HURD: Okay. Thanks.
CHAIR DREW: Moving on to Horse Heaven Wind Project. Ms. Moon, SEPA update.

MS. MOON: No. I'm doing the -- yeah, the SEPA update on the project. Thank you.

CHAIR DREW: Right.
MS. MOON: Good afternoon Council, Chair Drew, and Councilmembers. For the record, this is Amy Moon, an EFSEC staff member.

I'm providing the State Environmental Policy Act, or SEPA update, on the Horse Heaven Wind Project.

EFSEC staff continued its work preparing the draft environmental impact statement, known as the draft EIS, in close cooperation with our contractor Golder.

This work includes coordinating agency technical reviews as well as internal review and refinement of the draft EIS. Our work is focused on finalizing sections of the draft EIS, refinement of proposed minimization and mitigation opportunities, and establishing a new public comment database.

Does the Council have any questions?
CHAIR DREW: Are there any questions?
Okay. Thank you. Oh, you have more.
MS. MOON: I'm hearing no --
CHAIR DREW: Oh, you have more.
MS. MOON: I was going to say, hearing no
questions, I'm going to hand it off to -- for draft EIS publication update from Amy Hafkemeyer.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you, Ms. Moon. And good afternoon, Chair Drew, and Council. For the record, this is Amy Hafkemeyer.

EFSEC staff have been working very hard towards the completion of the DEIS, as described by Ms. Moon. We are working towards a late fall issuance date. Because the comment period will cover multiple seasonal holidays, EFSEC is intending a 45-day comment period to allow the public sufficient time to review the documents.

Are there any questions?
CHAIR DREW: Are there any questions?
Okay. Thank you.
Moving on to the Goose Prairie Solar Project update, Ms. Hafkemeyer.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
EFSEC staff are working with the certificate

1 holder and our contractors to review and refine preconstruction plans. The applicant is currently working on their initial site restoration plan, or ISRP, that will require Council review and approval. And we will update the Council once that is received and ready for the Council to review.

Are there any questions?
CHAIR DREW: Okay. Thank you.
Badger Mountain. We'll start with the scope draft EIS overview, Ms. Hafkemeyer.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
Staff have been working with our contractor to
establish a working schedule for the draft of the environmental impact statement or EIS. EFSEC will be preparing the EIS in accordance with Washington Administrative Code, or WAC 197-11 to include the resource for further explanation as presented at the August council meeting.

As a reminder, EFSEC staff identified the resource topic to include water resources wetlands, cultural and historic resources, vegetation, transportation, and wildlife and habitat.

EFSEC will be working with the applicant and our contractor towards a DEIS issuance of late first quarter or early second quarter 2023.

Are there any questions?
CHAIR DREW: Questions? Thank you. And then moving on to the next item on our agenda, the application for site certification extension review.

Go ahead, Ms. Hafkemeyer.
MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
As hopefully, you can see on the screen, we have a letter to request extension of the application review in your Council packets.

Per WAC 463-64-020, the Council shall report to the governor its recommendation as to the approval or rejection of an application for certification within 12 months of receipt by the Council of such an application, or such later time as is mutually agreed by the Council and the applicant.

The application for site certification was received by EFSEC on October 7, 2021. The applicant has submitted a letter, which you can see here, which requests an extension of 12 months to October 7, 2023.

The extension would allow time for the SEPA process and the adjudication process to occur for this project. Being an action by the Council, the request was open for public comment prior to this meeting and none were received.

Staff recommends that the Council approve this extension request as presented by the applicant.

And I will ask if there are any questions.
CHAIR DREW: Any questions?
I do believe that we didn't give very much notice on this action item.

So because of that, I will ask now if there is anyone present, outside of Councilmembers, who wish to make a comment on this extension request before the Council votes on it.

Is there anyone present who would like to make a comment on the extension request? Please raise your hand or unmute your microphone.

Okay. Hearing none, we will proceed to Council action. Is there --

MS. KELLY: Madam Chair --
CHAIR DREW: Yes.
MS. KELLY: -- this is Kate Kelly. I -can -- I have a quick question about the letter. CHAIR DREW: Yes. Go ahead.

MS. KELLY: So in conclusion, the letter says that they're requesting that the Council allocate the appropriate resources to complete and deliver a recommendation within the extended period.

I -- I'm not sure what that means or how -- the

1 Council -- does that just mean that they're -- that
2 because staffing shortage were occurring previous? Is
3 there some lack of resources at this point?

CHAIR DREW: I will let either Ms. Hafkemeyer or Ms. Bumpus answer that question.

MS. BUMPUS: This is --
MS. HAFKEMEYER: Sure. I can I jump in. Oh, sorry, Sonia.

MS. BUMPUS: Sorry. Go ahead, Ms. Hafkemeyer. Go ahead, Ms. Hafkemeyer.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Okay. I was -- I was just going to jump in and say $I$ believe that is in reference to staffing shortages that we've been working through recently.

And just indicate that we do have additional staff. We do have two new staff members with us here today, if you all from the introduction. As well as two more starting on Monday, the 26th. And additional interviews and applicants incoming.

So we're making progress towards increasing our staff. And hopefully this will assist in our work across projects. Thank you.

CHAIR DREW: Okay. So with that, any other questions?

Or is there a motion to approve the extension
requested for Badger Mountain?
Motion to approve.
MS. BREWSTER: This is Stacey Brewster. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Go ahead, Stacey. MS. BREWSTER: I move that we approve the extension that's been requested by Avangrid Renewables. CHAIR DREW: Thank you. Second. MS. KELLY: Kate Kelly. Second. CHAIR DREW: Kate second.

Thank you. I will say that -- that of late, there have been some staffing challenges. But there are a lot of complex issues as well that have been discovered and are being worked on by multiple parties on the Badger Mountain Project. And that this will also -- because it is an EIS, requires us to go to an adjudication as well.

So there are steps that we do have to move forward on. And I appreciate the agreement to an extension of one year which will give us quite sufficient time, and hopefully we won't use all of it. But quite sufficient time to conduct the necessary review and adjudication on this project.

So with that, all those in favor of the extension -- approving the extension request, say "aye." COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIR DREW: Opposed?

The motion is adopted. Thank you.
Moving on to our next item, Whistling Ridge. Ms. Hafkemeyer.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
EFSEC staff are waiting for the certificate holder to submit the remaining materials for the SCA amendment requests.

And there are no further updates at this time.
CHAIR DREW: Thank you. High Top and Ostrea, SEPA update, Ms. Hafkemeyer.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
EFSEC staff continue to work with the applicant and contractor agency for our review to refine and establish mitigation.

EFSEC staff anticipate issuing a mitigated determination of nonsignificance, or MDNS, with a 15-day public comment period in the coming weeks. We are working with the applicant and our agency contractors to refine the mitigation to be included.

Staff anticipates that the comment period will be complete and the MDNS will be prior to the October Council meeting.

Looking forward, the applicant and the Council had previously agreed to extend the expedited process request decision to October 20th. Staff would like to

1 identify that as a topic for Council consideration at the 2 next Council meeting on October 18th.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
So the second piece, then, is the mitigated determination of nonsignificance, which you expect will be issued by the Council director, and is not a Council action, before the October meeting.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Correct. Staff are working with our contracted agencies to refine the language for the mitigation measures in the MDNS. And so are working to prepare and complete those documents and will -- will follow the process for issuing that as outlined in WAC 197-11 for posting to the SEPA register and noticing for public comment.

CHAIR DREW: For a 15-day period?
MS. HAFKEMEYER: Correct.
CHAIR DREW: Yes.
So when we -- and the Council will also have access to review those materials, to see them, from the MDNS .

So we will discuss further at our -- expect to discuss further at our Council meeting in October the expedited processing request.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: Correct.
CHAIR DREW: Okay. Are there any questions from Councilmembers?

MS. BREWSTER: This is Stacey Brewster and

1 this is tangentially related.

MS. HAFKEMEYER: In part. Some of that discussion will be covered in the existing project design and in part of the staff memo as part of our review of

1 that concern. That would then support the MDNS.

CHAIR DREW: Okay. Thank you.
Does that help answer your questions, Ms. Brewster?

MS. BREWSTER: Yes. Thank you very much.
CHAIR DREW: Okay. Other questions?
Okay. Thank you. Good discussion.
Moving on to the Wautoma Solar Project update.
MS. HAFKEMEYER: Thank you.
EFSEC staff continue to work with the applicant and our contractors to review the application and work towards a SEPA threshold determination. EFSEC staff are preparing a data request for the applicant and will keep the Council updated as we progress.

Are there any questions?
CHAIR DREW: Questions?
Okay. Thank you.
At this time $I$ have a couple of items for the good of the order.

One is that $I$ would like to ask our new staff members, perhaps, to say hello to the Council and introduce yourselves.

We have another -- a Sonja -- no, a Sonja as opposed to a Sonya.

So Sonja, would you mind turning on your camera

1 so people can see who you are and say hello. Sonja is 2 our commerce specialist.

CHAIR DREW: Thank you very much.
We're so happy to have you join our team.
So the last item I would like to announce is that as of January 1, 2023, we are moving our council monthly meeting from the third Tuesday of the month to the third Wednesday of the month. So we'll change one day.

And the reason for that is that it conflicts where it is on the third Tuesday with the governor's cabinet meetings, which I would like to attend.

So we will be changing the meeting to the third Wednesday at 1:30 p.m. And it will also help us as multiple times in the year, we have discovered that our meeting falls the day after a three-day weekend which makes it a little more challenging for us to get all our items in order for the agenda.

And so for that practical reason as well, starting in 2023, we will move the date of our council meetings to the third Wednesday at 1:30 p.m.
