Major Issues with the Horse Heaven Wind Project

- In the Wrong Place. Too close to a major metropolitan area of 300,000+ people. Normally located in isolated, much less populated areas.
- 2. **Too many/too tall** wind turbines. Up to 244 turbines (500 to 671 feet tall). Biggest wind project in WA.
- 3. **Undesirable Aesthetics**. Loss of scenic vistas. Industrialization of agricultural areas. Will stick out like a sore thumb.
- 4. **Potential Impacts on Human Health.** Noise, vibrations, shadow flicker, loss of sleep, flashing red lights, DUST.
- 5. Impacts on Wildlife, Birds and Habitats. Effects on endangered species, loss of connectivity of shrub steppe habitats, bird, bat and insect kill. Intersects migration flyway.
- 6. Flashing Red Lights/Loss of Dark Skies. Biggest red light district in Washington.
- 7. **Safety Hazards.** Increased fire danger, DUST, proximity to highways, dripping oil, blade failures.
- 8. Why Here? Why Us? Power is not needed here. Poor wind resource (per Western Resource Adequacy Program, Washington has the lowest wind resource rating in the Pacific Northwest).
- 9. Loss of Quality of Life, Tranquility and Enjoyment of Property. Property values, recreational areas, and scenic views.
- 10. Lack of Local Control. Applicant bypassed local elected officials. Gov. Inslee makes the sole decision.
- 11. Too Many Unknowns. Deficiencies, omissions, and lack of transparency and specific details in the application. Will costs to the environment, humans and wildlife outweigh any benefits?
