The Horse Heaven Hills Wind and Solar farm would drastically change our view for the worse. Instead of wide-open views, we would see 15 to 20 200' tall windmills completely dominating the view. It would be ugly. And unnecessary.

My personal opinion is that wind and solar "renewable" energy sources are not the answer. They are too intermittent and waiting for the grid storage super battery to alleviate the intermittency is a fool's errand. And they are very low-density energy producers. How many acres will it take to replace a single natural gas turbine generator? Thinking we can electrify everything in the United States, greatly increasing our electric load, using wind and solar to make up the electrical generation difference is nonsense. If we really want to go "net zero", small modular nuclear reactors (SMR) are the only real solution. And I would support placing an SMR in the Horse Heaven Hills area. As long as it is out of the majority of home's line of sight, it would be OK by me.

And the Tri-Cities does not need more electrical production. Between the hydro power on the Columbia and Snake rivers and the Columbia Generating Nuke plant, we are doing our share to produce electricity for the Pacific Northwest and California. If some other community believes wind and solar is the right solution, let them build a wind and solar farm in their community.
