team, reporting the audit results to government and contractor management. Also
included in my experience were reviews and input to preliminary and final
environmental impact statements. Scope of projects included active nuclear power
plants, mining, and milling facilities, as well as decontamination and decommissioning
for fuel processing and reprocessing sites that included hazardous chemicals as well
uranium, plutonium, & cesium contaminated sites.

Q: Please state the address of your home and the name of the neighborhood in which it is located.

A: The address of my home is 220 Rachel Rd, Kennewick, WA 99338. My home is located in the El Rancho Reata subdivision.

Q: Please state how long you have lived at this address and why you chose to live here.

A: I have lived in the Tri-Cities over 28 years and came here because of my work on the Hanford Reservation for the Dept. of Energy and to get back to the Pacific Northwest where I grew up.

Q: Please describe your opinion on the effect this project will have on the property value of your home and other homes in the area.

A: This project will have a very negative impact on the financial and esthetic value of my home, my neighbors' homes, and the surrounding neighborhood homes.

The proposed project, based on my environmental experience and research, will damage valuable farmland and surrounding farms, will damage property values of surrounding homes and farms, will damage protected wildlife and wildlife habitat, will damage rare vistas, will worsen the Tri-Cities air quality (i.e., potentially hurt the health of Tri-Cities residents), as well as weaken the stability of our electrical grid system.

Further, the project is not cost effective and taxpayer funding is being inappropriately used for the project (i.e., the project cannot make money on its own business model without a taxpayer crutch) and the majority of local Benton County taxpayers do not want the project. In addition, the total environmental damage of the project is not being considered (i.e., cradle-to-grave aspects of the project are not being considered).

Specifically, the environmental damage done at out-of-U.S. locations of rare earth material excavations used in the wind turbines and solar panels is not being considered. Contaminating other countries' land resources and misusing the country's human work force is not being considered. Nor is the project considering that the taxpayers and farmers renting out their land will be stuck with the decontamination and decommissioning bill since there is no evidence the company has put up sufficient collateral to perform these activities at end of life for the wind turbines and the solar panels.

In short: no objective evidence has been provided for justification of the Horse Heaven Hills Wind and Solar project nor the missing cradle-to-grave evaluations.

Q: Please describe your opinion of any other issues or concerns you have about the project.

A: The Washington State government (i.e., our employees) is going against the will of the local Benton County inhabitants for a project they (i.e., the WA State employees involved) would not have in their neighborhood or their back yard. Basically, this is a "not in my back yard" project where the WA State employees want the money coming in from the project but don't want the downside in their areas.

Further, WA State employees took an oath of office to protect and defend the Constitution. They are not adhering to that oath of office. This project violates the Constitution's Amendment IV: "The right of the people to be secure in their ..., houses,against unreasonable.... seizures, shall not be violated,...."

The project violates the Constitution's Amendment V: "No person shall... be deprived of property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation."

In essence WA State is allowing this project to take private property without just compensation and is allowing the misuse WA State taxpayer monies to benefit one industry over another.

I am voluntarily supporting and coordinating with the local community non-profit organization Tri-City CARES, I am here to share my concerns about the impacts the
