this area because of the well-managed development and the easy access to the highway. Although I don't have a view to the Horse Heaven Hills from my main windows, many homes in this neighborhood do.

Q: Please state the address of your home and the name of the neighborhood in which it is located.

A: I live at 1019 Lethbridge Ave, Richland. This is in the Brookshire Estates development near Duportail and Keene in South Richland.

Q: Please describe your opinion on the effect this project will have on property value of your home and other homes in the area.

A: The Horse Heaven Hills are the ONLY ridgeline landscape of the desert area of Southeastern Washington. I can't even imagine putting 25 miles of ugly wind turbines along the ridge. They will be a blight and eyesore to everyone. The 'west-siders' wouldn't want 25 miles of wind turbines along the Cascade ridge, why should we give up our only ridgeline?

Kennewick and South Richland are growing to the south. As growth continues, the sight of these ugly wind turbines will have a detrimental effect on who will move here and who would want the sight of a wind turbine out their windows. I know I wouldn't

be inclined to purchase a home anywhere near these wind turbines. Housing developments in Badger Canyon are already in close proximity and full view of where the turbines would be located. They are at risk of property devaluation as soon as the turbines are erected.

Q: Please describe your opinion of any other issues or concerns you have about the project.

I have many concerns with this project.

- First, why has Scout Energy gone to great lengths not to hold public hearings in the Tri-Cities? That tells me they know the county and residents are opposed.
- Second, Southeastern Washington doesn't need this 'new' power source. We have all the power we need from hydro-electric and nuclear sources. This power is probably meant for the west side of the state. Let them put the turbines there if they need the power. Why come and destroy our land and eco-structure?
- Third, the environmental impact statement does not cover the 'graveyard' of non-biodegradable waste from these turbines. The blades are ~200 feet in length.

 They don't last forever and must be disposed of. Why hasn't Scout told us where this graveyard will be located? I don't think Tri-Citians will like the answer. Why hasn't the EPA wanted to know?

1	Fourth, this project as proposed to remove many thousands of acres of farm
2	land. I would prefer the farm land over wind turbines any day. I think the farm land is
3	far more valuable in the future than these wind turbines.

8	organization Tri-City CARES. I am here to share my concerns about the impacts the
10	Horse Heaven Hills Project will have on my home, property values, and the other
11	homes in my neighborhood and other similarly situated neighborhoods in Tri-Cities. I
12	acknowledge that I may be cross-examined during the adjudication hearings.
