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1 BE IT REMEMBERED that on Thursday, October 3, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. Pacific time, before 2 3 the Washington Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council; Kathleen Drew, Chair; and Dan Gerard, 4 Administrative Law Judge, the following proceedings 5 were had, via videoconference, to wit: 6 7 8 9 10 CHAIR DREW: Okay. Good evening, 11 everyone. This is Kathleen Drew, chair of the Energy 12 Facility Site Evaluation Council, calling this 13 meeting to order. 14 This meeting is -- first of all, this meeting is 15 for the Wautoma Solar energy project. This is a 16 public hearing on the adjudicative hearing for this 17 project. The purpose of this adjudicative proceeding is to determine if the Council should recommend to 18 19 the governor preemption of the local jurisdiction's 20 land-use provisions, and if so, what conditions should be included in the draft site certification 21 2.2 agreement which considers state or local governmental 23 or community interests affected by the project. For 24 those of you who are offering comments, I ask that 25 you stay within that topic.

Administrative law judge: 2 Dan 3 Gerard. 4 JUDGE GERARD: Present. 5 MS. GRANTHAM: And do we have anyone present for the counsel for the environment? 6 7 Chair, there is a quorum. CHAIR DREW: Thank you. 8 9 At this point, I'll turn it over to Judge Gerard. 10 JUDGE GERARD: Good evening, everyone. And thank you for your attendance tonight. 11 12 As Chair Drew had stated just a moment ago, the 13 topics are limited to what she articulated just a 14 moment ago. 15 I would ask that everyone do speak loudly and clearly. We are recording these proceedings. And we 16 17 have asked that everyone limit their comments to 18 three minutes. 19 So without further ado, if we are ready, I'll go 20 ahead and call the first participant. David Robert, are you present? 21 2.2 DAVID ROBERT: Yes, I am. 23 JUDGE GERARD: All right. If you'd 24 like to make a comment, sir, please go ahead and 25 begin.



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1	DAVID ROBERT: Could you just tell	
2	the the what we're supposed to comment? I	
3	missed that real quick. I'm sorry.	
4	JUDGE GERARD: Sure. Chair Drew	
5	DAVID ROBERT: Limit it to	
6	JUDGE GERARD: I'll let her if	
7	you don't mind, Chair Drew, would you repeat just	
8	the the scope of the the proceedings	
9	DAVID ROBERT: Yes.	
10	JUDGE GERARD: just so all the	
11	rest of everyone else is aware? If not, I can	
12	certainly take it up and and repeat it.	
13	CHAIR DREW: I have it. It's right	
14	here in front of me.	
15	So this is the public hearing on the adjudicative	
16	hearing, and the Council has limited the adjudicative	
17	proceeding to the subject of land use and whether or	
18	not the Council should recommend to the governor	
19	preemption of the local jurisdiction's land-use	
20	provision, and if so, what conditions should be	
21	included in the draft site certification agreement,	
22	which consider state or local governmental or	
23	community interests affected by the project.	
24	So we're asking the public to comment, if they're	
25	commenting on this adjudicative proceeding, to keep	



1	their comments limited to that topic. Okay?
2	DAVID ROBERT: Okay.
3	JUDGE GERARD: Very good.
4	DAVID ROBERT: Yeah, I'm I'm
5	Dave Robert, one of the brothers who own the ranch

6 where the site will be put at.

One of the things I wanted to say was the site, I 7 think, is an excellent situation because we're 40 8 9 miles west of the Tri-Cities and 12 miles north of 10 The land that will be under the solar, Sunnyside. 11 some -- just about 700 acres is irrigated, but we 12 have a declining well, so the water in some sense is 13 really not considered prime farmland anymore, and the 14 rest of the land that's going to be on is pretty much 15 sagebrush and CRP land.

16 So I just think it's just one of the best 17 locations we could have for solar. It's very 18 isolated. We're surrounded with no -- you know, no 19 people able to even look in, 'cause we got the 20 Rattlesnake Ridge on one side, the Hanford 21 reservation on the other, and another small ridge. 2.2 And just to the west of us, we have a few neighbors. 23 So I'm just suggesting that this would be a great 24 site, and it'd be -- it'd be a win-win for everybody. 25 Thank you very much.



1	JUDGE GERARD: Thank you,
2	Mr. Robert.
3	With that, we'll go ahead and move on to the next
4	speaker who has signed up, and that would be Randy
5	Robert.
6	Randy Robert, are you present?
7	RANDY ROBERT: I am.
8	JUDGE GERARD: Very good.
9	And if you'd like to make a comment, please go
10	ahead and begin.
11	RANDY ROBERT: Yes. Kind of the
12	same way my brother was saying, the Wautoma Solar
13	energy project is a very good option for renewable
14	energy. The location is very remote but has easy
15	access to a BPA substation. The land that would be
16	under solar panels is not prime farmland, along with
17	the water table dropping in the aquifer makes for
18	farming very challenging.
19	This project would save water and help replenish
20	the aquifer. The Robert Ranch would still raise
21	cattle and farm in the future. So, to me, this is a
22	ideal spot, and and it would be good for our
23	family going into the future. Thank you.
24	JUDGE GERARD: Thank you, sir.
25	All right. Moving on the next to the next



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1	participant: Allison Keeler. There is a note that	
2	you may not be present, but if you are, go ahead and	
3	speak up, please.	
4	All right. We'll come back to to Ms. Keeler	
5	at the end to see if she did join at that point. So	
6	let's move along to the next speaker.	
7	Michael Robert, are you present, sir?	
8	MICHAEL ROBERT: I am. This is	
9	JUDGE GERARD: (Speaking	
10	simultaneously.)	
11	MICHAEL ROBERT: Michael Robert,	
12	also one of the Robert brothers. And I also want to	
13	comment that the the location for this solar panel	
14	project is is at is very, very isolated.	
15	There it's as indicated, it's at closest 12 to	
16	15 miles from any population area, and it is in a	
17	valley where where basically it is, you know, not	
18	easily seen.	
19	There's two major highways that kind of go	
20	that kind of go by the ranch and where the solar	
21	project is, but you would only see the see the	
22	project for about three miles on Highway 341, and you	
23	would only see it for about one mile on Highway 24.	
24	So it's a very it's a very good location for	
25	for a solar panel project and at least from the	



1 public viewpoint.

And also to reiterate, the well has dropped 2 3 several hundred feet 'cause of the aquifer being depleted. And if -- without being able to irrigate 4 5 this land, the land really is very marginal, you know, wheat country. The history of the ranch 6 started as a sheep ranch, which didn't -- and then 7 eventually a well was drilled to do farming. 8 But with the well dropping, it is not -- not feasible to 9 10 be farming in the way we used to do our farming. 11 Thank you. 12 JUDGE GERARD: Thank you, sir. 13 Let's move on, then, next, to the next 14 participant. 15 Mary Larsen, are you present? 16 Mary Larsen, if you're present, would you go 17 ahead and turn yourself off "mute" and speak up. Ιf

not, we'll go ahead and come back to you at the end.

All right. It doesn't appear so at this point, so we'll go ahead and move on to the next speaker. Excuse me.

Celene Robert, are you present? Celene Robert, if you're present, go ahead and turn yourself off "mute," and speak up, please.

Okay. We'll go ahead and just for the sake of



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1	time, we'll move on to the last signed-up
2	participant, and we'll circle back to the other ones.
3	Robin Robert, are you present, sir?
4	ROBIN ROBERT: Yes, I am.
5	JUDGE GERARD: (Speaking
б	simultaneously.)
7	ROBIN ROBERT: I'm one of the other
8	brothers. Hi. I think my brothers pretty pretty
9	much covered it all.
10	I'm 71 years old, and and it'd be nice if the
11	solar went in. We'd have steady income for the next
12	25 years. And they pretty much covered the whole
13	thing about the water situation and the isolation of
14	our ranch compared to other towns.
15	That's pretty much it. Thank you.
16	JUDGE GERARD: Thank you, sir.
17	All right. So let's go ahead and circle back to
18	the three other names I called earlier. Then we can
19	see if there's any other ones that have signed up
20	that were not on the list I was provided.
21	Allison Keeler, have you managed to join us?
22	MR. SHARP: Judge Gerard and
23	Kathleen Drew, this is Dave Sharp.
24	JUDGE GERARD: Yes, sir.
25	MR. SHARP: I'm not sure if she can



1	hear me, but, Kathleen Drew, when people are dialing
2	in, you normally give instructions on how to mute and
3	unmute themselves. I'm wondering if perhaps the
4	people are dialing in and can't get unmuted.
5	CHAIR DREW: Ms. Grantham, do you
6	see anyone who is trying to unmute?
7	MS. GRANTHAM: I do not see any
8	phone calls who have called in, but in case anybody
9	has joined through their Teams app maybe on their
10	phone and is struggling to unmute, I can instruct you
11	that you can attempt to use star 6 or pound 6.
12	Though I have been checking the participants for
13	whenever ALJ Gerard is calling the names, and I do
14	not see the names that he is calling at the moment.
15	JUDGE GERARD: Yeah.
16	CHAIR DREW: Thank you.
17	JUDGE GERARD: I was I was
18	actually checking that as well, and I don't see these
19	participants, but I was hoping or I was concerned
20	that they maybe called in under someone else's name,
21	but it doesn't appear that's the case.
22	Thank you, Mr. Sharp, for that.

8	MS. GRANTHAM: Not that I am aware
9	of. I have been checking the EFSEC in-boxes that
10	people have been e-mailing into to sign up, and we
11	haven't received any new ones as of yet.
12	JUDGE GERARD: Okay. So during
13	this interim period, I'm going to pass the reins back
14	to Chair Drew, and she will inform us all how how
15	we'd like to proceed going forward now that all the
16	speakers who are present have spoken.
17	CHAIR DREW: I think at this point,
18	ask anyone else who is on the line if they wish to
19	speak, and if not, we'll conclude the hearing.
20	JUDGE GERARD: Okay. So with that,
21	if there are people who would like to speak, if you
22	have the the program up, go ahead and raise your
23	hand just so we can control the flow. If you don't
24	have that functionality, go ahead and just speak up,
25	and we'll we'll take you in order.



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1	Is anybody else present who has not spoken that
2	would like to add to the the public comment
3	portion of this adjudication?
4	Chair Drew, I'm not seeing anybody. How long
5	would you like to wait before you adjourn?
6	CHAIR DREW: I think we have heard
7	all the testimony that we're going to hear tonight,
8	so I think it's time to adjourn.
9	Thank you very much for all your participation.
